From the Pastor's Pencil

I hope you all enjoyed a happy and blessed Christmas, and I pray that we will all grow in our Christian faith and deepen our Christian practices in the New Year.

The next Christian holiday (or holy day) is the Epiphany, which is celebrated on January 6 every year. Epiphany commemorates three events in the life of Jesus: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), his baptism (Mark 1:9), and the changing of water into wine at the wedding feast at Cana (John 2:1-11).

What ties the three events together is that each one shows that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God. A suggestion for you: on January 6, read those three passages in your Bible and think about how each event reveals that Iesus is God's Son.

For example, one way the Magi's visit reveals that Jesus is the Son of God is

that even very wise men from a distant land knew that the birth of Jesus was a world-changing event and that he deserved their gifts and their worship.

The time between Christmas Day and the Epiphany used to be observed in the Church as the season of Christmastide or the Twelve Days of Christmas. I'm sure you know the song about the gifts "my true love gave to me" on the twelve days of Christmas.

Another thing you might do to celebrate Epiphany (or on January 1 if you make New Year's resolutions) is to make a list of 12 gifts you hope God will give you and 12 gifts you plan to give to God in the New Year.

For example, one of the gifts I hope God will give me in the New Year is the ability to help our church grow and prosper. One of the gifts I plan to give



God in the New Year is spending more time in prayer (although that is really another gift I hope God will give to me).

If you take time as we begin our New Year to read the three passages of Scripture I mentioned and to make your lists of 12 gifts, I hope you will stop by church or give me a call and let me know what ideas you came up with. I'm always very interested to hear what God is doing in your life and how your spiritual practices are helping you to come ever closer to Him.



We also need volunteers to run sound during Worship. There are sign up sheets on the bulletin board at the Communication Table.


ARE WE REALLY SERVANTS OF JESUS?
