From the Pastor's Pencil



One of our church members suggested that we include my sermon A White X on a Red Cup in the Caller to share again with the congregation a little of the history and beliefs of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

Good idea, but the sermon's a lot longer than my usual Pastor's Pencil, so we'll break the sermon into two parts and print Part II in the next Caller.

Here's Part I:

Kids ask some hard questions! Over the years, kids have asked me, "Who were God's parents?" "When was God born?" "Are God and Jesus the same thing?"

"Is the Holy Spirit a ghost?" "Was Jesus a Christian?"

"Do our pets get to be with us in heaven?" "Do you get to do anything in heaven or do you just sit there?"

Good questions! And another one was, "What is that red cup thing with the white X on it on our church sign?

This morning I'd like to talk with you for a little while about that red cup with the white X on it and the denomination our congregation belongs to—the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

Here are the Top Ten Things to Know about the Disciples:

Number 10: That red cup with the white X is a chalice with a St. Andrew's cross on it. The chalice symbolizes the importance of the Lord's Supper in the life and worship of Disciples.

The color red signifies vitality, spirit, and sacrifice.

The white cross that looks like an X is the national cross of Scotland. It's shaped like the cross on which Jesus' disciple Andrew was crucified. Andrew is the patron saint of

So, what's the connection between our denomination and Scotland? There aren't even any Disciples churches in Scotland!

That's number 9 on our top ten list: The founding fathers of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) were Presbyterian ministers from Scotland: Barton W. Stone and Thomas and Alexander Campbell.

Our denomination was formed out of two separate movements seeking Christian unity in the early 1800s. In western Pennsylvania, Thomas and Alexander Campbell rebelled against strict Presbyterian doctrine that forbade Christians of different denominations from receiving Holy Communion together.

The Campbells called their movement the Disciples.

At the same time, in Kentucky, another Scotch Presbyterian minister, Barton W. Stone, rebelled against the use of formal creeds such as the Apostles Creed from the 6th century as tests or articles of faith that Christians had to agree to in order to become church members and to receive Holy Communion.

Stone called his movement the Christians.

The aims and practices of Campbells' *Disciples* and Stone's *Christians* were so similar that the two movements united by a handshake agreement in Lexington, Kentucky, in 1832, and became the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

The Stone-Campbell Movement hoped to restore Christian unity by returning to the faith and practices of the New Testament.

"No creed but Christ" was one of their mottoes.

That brings us to number eight on our Top Ten List: the beliefs of our denomination's founding fathers. First, "No creed but Christ." Affirming that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God, was the only requirement for church membership.

Second, Scripture was the only rule of faith: They said, "Where the Scriptures speak, we speak; where the Scriptures are silent, we are silent."

Third, Christian unity: They said, "The church of Christ upon earth is essentially, intentionally, and constitutionally one."

The founding fathers of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) didn't want to just add one more denomination to a Christianity that was already too divided.

The first Disciples saw themselves not as a denomination but as a movement for Christian unity.

And fourth, open-mindedness and freedom of belief. They said, "In essentials, unity; in nonessentials, liberty; in all things, charity."

In other words, Disciples believe in the essential tenet of our faith that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God.

Each Disciple is free to have his or her own interpretation of the nonessentials of the faith, when that understanding is based on a diligent and prayerful study of Scripture.

We don't all have to believe exactly the same things to be a Disciple.

And in all things, love—even when we disagree. That's a hard one to practice. In all things, love—even when we disagree.

Number seven in our Top Ten List of important things to know about the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ): Today's Disciples remain committed to those ideas of our founding fathers.

Our denomination's vision is "to be a faithful, growing church that demonstrates true community, deep Christian spirituality and a passion for justice."

Our mission is "To be and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ, witnessing, loving and serving from our doorsteps to the ends of the earth."

The world has changed a lot since the 1800s, but today's Disciples remain committed to the Bible, to freedom of thought, to unity, and to love.

We'll end Part I there and pick up where we left off in the next Caller.
