
We all want to control what goes on in our lives -- personally, professionally, socially, and more. However, things happen everyday that show us that we aren't in control of anything -- despite our best efforts. When that reality smacks us in the face, we become overwhelmed, anxious, depressed, confused and often feel isolated, even from the ones we love and who love us the most.

My spiritual/theological point on Sunday was that when Jesus set his face to Jerusalem (Luke 9:51-62), it was not to go there and assume control of the government, economy, and every other element of society. Rather, it was to go there and become completely immersed in the chaos that is human life -- pain, suffering, confusion, brokenness, and even death. God, through Jesus, shows us that God is not that kind of controlling God. God, through Jesus, shows us that God is willing to feel everything we feel, experience everything we experience, hold us, love us, and bring us to the other side of that experience.

We are blessed to worship a God who desires to be in deep relationship with each of us, to intimately and fully know us. God desires to maintain that relationship with us for every moment of every day that we walk on this earth. As the Apostle Paul reminds us in Romans, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ."

So, while we experience chaos and being overwhelmed by the things we cannot control, we know that we are never alone, never separated from the deepest relationship, the most complete love we can ever know.

I am confident that folks who were present heard this message and maybe a whole lot more. I'm okay with people interpreting the word through the lens and/ or filter of their own experience and faith journey. I am okay with people accusing me of stirring the calm waters of this congregation. I am here to do that, in part. But, know that what I am doing as a leader and as a preacher is piguing
